RE: Application for Renewal of Texas Forensic Science Commission Accreditation under Title 37, Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 651

Dear Ms. Meadows:

With some exceptions, the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Article 38.35, requires Texas Forensic Science Commission (“FSC”) accreditation as a predicate to the admission of the forensic analysis of physical evidence and expert testimony relating to the evidence in a criminal case.

As the designee of the Texas Forensic Science Commission’s Presiding Officer, I have considered your application based on your national accreditations from ANAB and ABFT and grant full FSC Accreditation to NMS Labs, 200 Welsh Road, Horsham, PA 19044 for the following forensic discipline:

Toxicology	Qualitative Determination Quantitative Measurement

The current term of ANAB/ABFT accreditation is from 7/1/2019 to 4/30/2023. **The term of FSC accreditation begins 9/1/15 and continues until such time that the accreditation from ANAB and ABFT are no longer current.**

FSC accreditation is contingent upon compliance with Title 37, Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 651, including requirements of reporting correspondence, reports or communication between the laboratory and the accrediting body. FSC accreditation will be automatically rescinded at the same date and time as ANAB and ABFT withdraw your laboratory accreditation.
